#### Small Business Grants Program

#### Purpose:

The Small Business Grant Program provides operating assistance to business owners employing 1-25 persons and have suffered a loss due to COVID-19. The source of the funds is HUD's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) program and therefore businesses must be owned or employ low-moderate income persons. The applicant can apply up to \$20,000 in assistance for eligible expenses that occurred after 3/17/20 including:

- · Payroll
- Rent/Mortgage
- Utilities
- · Loss of Inventory
- COVID Related Purchases

Applications will be accepted continuously until funding has been depleted. Minority and Women owned businesses will receive priority in the selection process, and 25% of the total grant allocation will be set aside for MBE/WBE businesses. Grants can't duplicate funding requested and received through other federal sources or programs.

Applications were accepted beginning 10/1/20. 53% of the funds have been committed and expensed. 55% are minority or woman owned businesses. The average grant for approved applications is \$18,947. Reasons for denial include not meeting income requirements, landlords wanting rent money, not in City limits, non-local chain etc.

## Operation COVID-19 Programs

#### **Basic Needs Assistance**

Operation COVID-19 Basic Needs Assistance Program was a foreclosure/ eviction mitigation and utility prevention shut-off program created by the City of Topeka and administered by the Community Resources Council (CRC). \$1.5 million in CARES Act funds was expended to qualified applicants to help cover expenses and help keep people housed and with utilities. Applications were accepted December 2020 through September 2021.

#### Mortgage Assistance

Operation COVID-19 Mortgage Assistance Program funds are currently available for households behind in their mortgage payments due to COVID-19. Applicants must be city residents, have documented Covid-related income losses after March, 2020, and make no more than 100% of the area median income. The program is operated by Community Resources Council (CRC) with \$400,000 in CARES Act funds through the City of Topeka.

## Homeless Emergency Solutions Grant (HESG)

Homeless Emergency Solutions Grant (HESG) is a competitive grant process that agencies can apply for each year. The Continuum of Care approves the selection of the sub-recipients. HESG can only be spent for Rapid-Rehousing, Homeless Prevention, Homeless Management Information System and Shelter Operations. HESG is funded by HUD. The City was awarded nearly \$1.9M of HESG for COVID-19 related expenses (HESG-CV) to prevent homelessness in 2020.
