ShaMecha shared that the poverty simulation is looking for volunteers and ask members present to consider becoming a volunteer for the event.
- Quincy St. Street Parking: Joe shared concerns regarding the parking issue in downtown Topeka on Quincy specifically for bikes. Joe share concerns of how the parking would affect individuals with vison impairment. Ernestor provided information on the new parking design and where to find accessible parking near

city hall. Ernestor shared that he could request public works to do a presentation on the project if needed. Michael expressed how the change could potentially affect a visually impaired person either as a driver or as a passenger.

- o Bird Scooters: Steve shared he has not seen a lot of scooters in the area. Ernestor provided information on the contract which will expire in October 2026. The full contract was shared with all members of the ADA Advisory Council.
