
Electric Buses

 Topeka Metro is looking to continue exploring electric vehicles in other contexts including paratransit and microtransit services The 2024 Low-No Grant Process is open

 Topeka Metro is considering applying for some electric vans, cutaways buses or fixed route buses




- Modtopeka.app
- On-demand service with reservations made on a computer, phone app or via telephone
- Pay in cash in person, or via credit card on the app or online
- Curb to curb within the service zone
- Can connect to existing fixed route (larger buses)
- Started service Jan 30, 2023
- Generally seeing increasing use as we continue to connect with neighborhoods and agencies





- Seeing heatmaps indicating ridership broadening with users originating from and going to more locations through time.
- Getting consistent positive feedback from users
- Seeing continuous sign-ups on users accounts
- Observing broad users across the zone.
- Destinations include grocers, employers, multiple health facilities, private residence to residence and others
- Working towards offering agencies the ability to subsidize trips to their facilities



METRO ON-DEMAND

Roughly where is the zone?

- North Border: I70
- South Border: I-35 and 29th St.
- East Border: Croco Rd.
- West Border: Kansas Ave. (from I-70 to 25th/29th) and then Topeka Blvd. further South
- Ride from point-to-point within the geographical zone
- Connect and transfer to fixed route buses to travel outside the zone

What You Need to Know:

MOD HOURS OF OPERATION:

Monday - Friday from 5:35 a.m. - 6:40 p.m. Saturday from 8:15 a.m. to 6:40 p.m.

SCHEDULING YOUR TRIP:

- Download the MOD Topeka app on your mobile phone.
- The MOD Topeka app is available on Apple App Store (iOS) and Google Play Store (Android).
- Use the <u>www.modtopeka.app</u> website to schedule your ride or find information.
- If you don't have a mobile phone, call our customer service at 785-783-7000 & push Option #5 to book your ride.
- No walk-ups. Must schedule ride in advance.
