NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE	
CITY OF TOPEKA,	KANSAS, that the following is hereby adopted as the City of Topeka's
legislative agenda f	or the 2024 legislative session:
Home Rule. Consi	stent with the Home Rule Amendment of the Kansas Constitution
approved by voters	in 1960, our local Governing Body, as the body closest to the people,
is in the best position	n to make decisions for our community, particularly in regards to local
tax and revenue de	cisions. The City of Topeka strongly supports legislation that respects
our constitutional ho	ome rule authority.
Finance & Taxatio	n.
(1) Taxing and S	Spending Powers; Local Ad Valorem Reduction Fund (LAVTR). Local
spending an	d taxing decisions are best left to the local officials representing the
citizens that	elected them. Moreover, the City joins with the League of Kansas
Municipalitie	s in urging the Legislature to follow state law by funding the LAVTR
program.	
(2) Business Co	mpetition. We strongly oppose any state-imposed limits on the taxing
and spending	g authority of cities and legislation that seek to exempt/waive property
taxes for son	ne businesses at the expense of the tax base as a whole on the basis

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- 25 (3) <u>Sales Tax</u>. As the majority of commerce occurs inside city limits, cities should be 26 able to impose voter-approved local sales taxes without interference from the 27 county.
 - (4) <u>Unfunded Mandates</u>. If the state or federal governments seek to promote particular policy objectives, such mandates should be accompanied by an appropriate level of funding.

Public Welfare.

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- (1) <u>Abandoned Housing</u>. We support legislation that would give cities additional tools to deal with vacant and abandoned housing.
- (2) Mental Health. We support allocating additional resources for mental health programs, up to and including the establishment of a new state mental health facility in the region to provide additional bed space for patients with mental health issues.
- (3) Medicaid Expansion. Kansas is one of only 11 states that has not expanded Medicaid eligibility which is supported by 7 out of 10 Kansas voters. We urge the Legislature to do so in order to provide health care to individuals who cannot afford to access these services.
- (4) <u>Homelessness</u>. We support allocating a portion of the budget surplus to help cities address homelessness and its underlying causes which include a lack of affordable housing and social services.
- (5) Minimum Wage. We support passage of 2023 S.B. 140 which would allow cities to utilize their Home Rule power to require employers to pay wages higher than the minimum wage.
