4 5 6 7 8	AN ORDINANCE introduced by Council Member Brendan Jensen, creating Chapter 10.80 in Title 10 of the Topeka Municipal Code concerning Pedestrian and Traffic Safety.
8 9	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF TOPEKA, KANSAS:
10	Section 1. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
11	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.010, which said section reads as follows:
12	Findings.
13	The governing body makes the following findings:
14	(a) The high volume of motor vehicles travelling on congested roadways in
15	the city makes mixing pedestrian and the moving, slowing or temporarily stopping of
16	motor vehicles in the same space, at the same time, inherently dangerous.
17	(b) Pedestrians distracting drivers from the task of driving by approaching a
18	stopped vehicle, attracting and/or attempting to attract the attention of the driver of a
19	motor vehicle for the purpose of inducing that driver to slow or stop the vehicle to
20	facilitate the transfer of anything by the pedestrian to the driver or passenger is
21	hazardous to public safety, both for occupants of motor vehicles and for pedestrians.
22	(c) The prohibitions set forth in this chapter are narrowly tailored to serve the
23	significant interest of promoting and protecting the public health, safety and welfare and
24	that these prohibitions leave open ample alternative channels of communication
25	throughout the city.
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(d) It is the intent of this chapter to protect the health, safety and general
welfare of the citizens of the city, to assure the free, orderly, undisrupted movement of
motor vehicles on designated highways within city limits, and to provide for the safety
and interests of pedestrians and of occupants of motor vehicles located on designated
roadways within the city and to reduce the number of pedestrian and motor vehicles
occurring within the city.

34 Pedestrians are increasingly using highways and roadways in ways for (e) which the roads were not designed or intended. These uses include approaching 35 36 vehicles when stopped or in use or staying upon medians and in the public right of way 37 for purposes other than crossing the highway. These activities create safety hazards for pedestrians and distract drivers, making automobile accidents more likely. This chapter 38 39 is designed to decrease the safety hazards by restricting such activity. These safety 40 concerns are most acute in the busiest streets within the city identified as arterial streets 41 and those within a congested area.

## 42 <u>Section 2</u>. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended 43 by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.020, which said section reads as follows:

74	Section 3. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended
75	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.030, which said section reads as follows:
76	Prohibition: Pedestrians Entering or Staying Upon Roadways at Certain
77	Intersections.
78	(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to go upon any roadway or remain
79	alongside any roadway at any of the intersections designated in subsection 10.80.020
80	and approach a vehicle stopped on the roadway or attempt to attract the attention of the
81	driver or occupant of a motor vehicle for the purpose of inducing the driver of the motor
82	vehicle to remain stopped, slow or stop the vehicle to facilitate a transfer of anything
83	from the driver or occupant of the vehicle to the pedestrian or the transfer of anything by
84	the pedestrian to the driver or occupant.
85	(b) No person shall be upon the median of a roadway at any of the
86	intersections designated in subsection 10.80.020 unless that person is in the process of
87	crossing the roadway.
88	(c) No person shall activate a pedestrian crosswalk signal for any purpose
89	other than to stop traffic to allow such person to cross the roadway.
90	(d) It is prima facie evidence of a violation of subsection (b) and (c) if the
91	person stays on the median or at the intersection through two consecutive opportunities
92	to legally cross the roadway. This may include a change in the traffic control signal or
93	lack of traffic. After two such consecutive opportunities, such person shall not be
94	considered to be using the crosswalk for purposes of the exception in subsection (f)(1).
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97 (e) No driver or operator of a motor vehicle shall park, stop, or leave standing	97
98 <u>a vehicle on a designated roadway or suddenly decrease the speed of such vehicle or</u>	98
99 deviate from a traffic lane for the purpose of responding to persons violating subsection	99

01 (f) Exceptions. This chapter does not apply to:	101

11 <u>Section 4</u> . That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amended	111

14 Any person who violates the provisions of TMC 10.80.030 is guilty of a	114
15 misdemeanor. Upon conviction, a person shall be sentenced to a fine not to exceed	115
16 four hundred and ninety-nine dollars (\$499) and/or imprisonment not to exceed thirty	116

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120	Section 5. That The Code of the City of Topeka, Kansas, is hereby amende
121	by adding a section, to be numbered 10.80.050, which said section reads as follows:
122	Severability.
123	If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or other provision of this ordinance
124	is held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decisio
125	shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
126	Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after it
127	passage, approval and publication in the official City newspaper.
128	Section 7. This ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or rules
129	or portions thereof, which are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.
130	Section 8. Should any section, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declare
131	invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the validity of th
132	ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
