Purpose

The annual budget is a financial plan for the City of Topeka that serves two primary purposes:

Planning

- Projecting revenues and expenses helps the City create a balanced budget
- Allows us to manage operations and service delivery

• Service Priorities

 The budget outlines what services and programs the City will fund



Budget Timeline

May/June

Departments and the Budget Office develop the proposed budget

June/July

- Revenue Neutral Rate discussions and property tax revenue estimate
- Budget presented to Governing Body
- Public outreach

August/September

 Budget is presented to Governing Body and adopted for the upcoming fiscal year

If the City of Topeka adjusts its tax mill levy, every 1 mill corresponds to \$17.25 for a property appraised at \$150,000



How are my property taxes calculated?

- Multiply the appraised value by the appropriate "assessment percentage" of property which is appraised value * .115 = assessed value
 - 1. \$150,000 * .115 = **\$17,250**
- 2. Assessed Value * Mill Levy / 1,000 = Tax Bill
 - 1. ((\$17,250) * (36.952)) / 1,000 = \$637.42



Major Revenue Sources

Fees for Service: Customer charges for services such as water, stormwater, wastewater, and parking

Franchise Fees: Received from local utilities for the use of rights-of-ways


Licenses & Permits: Revenue for various permitting and licensing services in the City Clerk and Development Services divisions

Property Taxes: Derived from taxes levied on real and personal property

Sales Taxes: The City of Topeka receives three sales taxes: two for direct operations and one for countywide purposes




General Fund Revenue Breakdown (2024 Budget)

Expense Types

Personnel: Expenditures related to employee compensation and benefit costs

Contractual: Expenditures related to the operation of the City. Examples include insurance, utilities, and printing services


Commodities: Expenditures related to materials used to carry out city services. Examples include office supplies, rock salt, and fuel

Debt: Expenditures related to the payment of principal and interest of debt obligations


Other Payments: Expenditures in this category include transfers between funds and debt payments for the Enterprise Funds
