**Mobile Access Partnership (MAP) at The Salvation Army of Topeka
During Winter Months**

Topeka, KS (Oct. 15, 2022)

Beginning, Tuesday, November 1st through Thursday, March 30, 2023, from 9a to 2p, MAP will be at The Salvation Army of Topeka, during the winter months.

This is a collaborative effort between Valeo Behavioral Health Care, Topeka Rescue Mission, Stormont-Vail Health, Shawnee County Health Dept., and the Topeka Police Department's mental health unit.

MAP is a partnership between several agencies joined together to address the complex needs of individuals experiencing homelessness. Through the joint efforts of this partnership, primary care, mental health care, food assistance, and hygiene services will be available together in one location for comprehensive and accessible care.

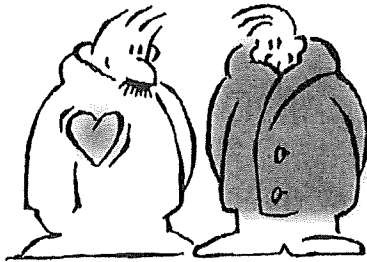

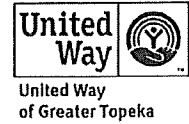

Registering adult **MUST BRING** his/her **Photo I.D.**, **Proof of Income for the ENTIRE household**, and **everyone's Social Security cards** (copies or document with SSN number listed are also accepted).

Documentation for Proof of Income:

Any State assistance or money received for food, rent, etc. is considered income. Bring copies that apply to your household. **VISION cards are not proof**, you **MUST** show the award letter from the State.

APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE PROCESSED WITHOUT ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION. You will be given your application back and asked to return when you have proper information.

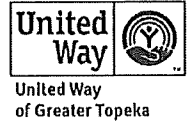

Mars Wrigley is Shawnee County’s first Adopt-A-Roadway group participant. Mars Wrigley Topeka associates and immediate family members (at least 13 years old) will be participating in this event.

“Mars Wrigley associates are excited about this program and hopefully we can get more organizations to follow in Shawnee County’s Adopt-A-Roadway program,” said Mike Heatwole, Supply Excellence Manager, Mars Wrigley.
