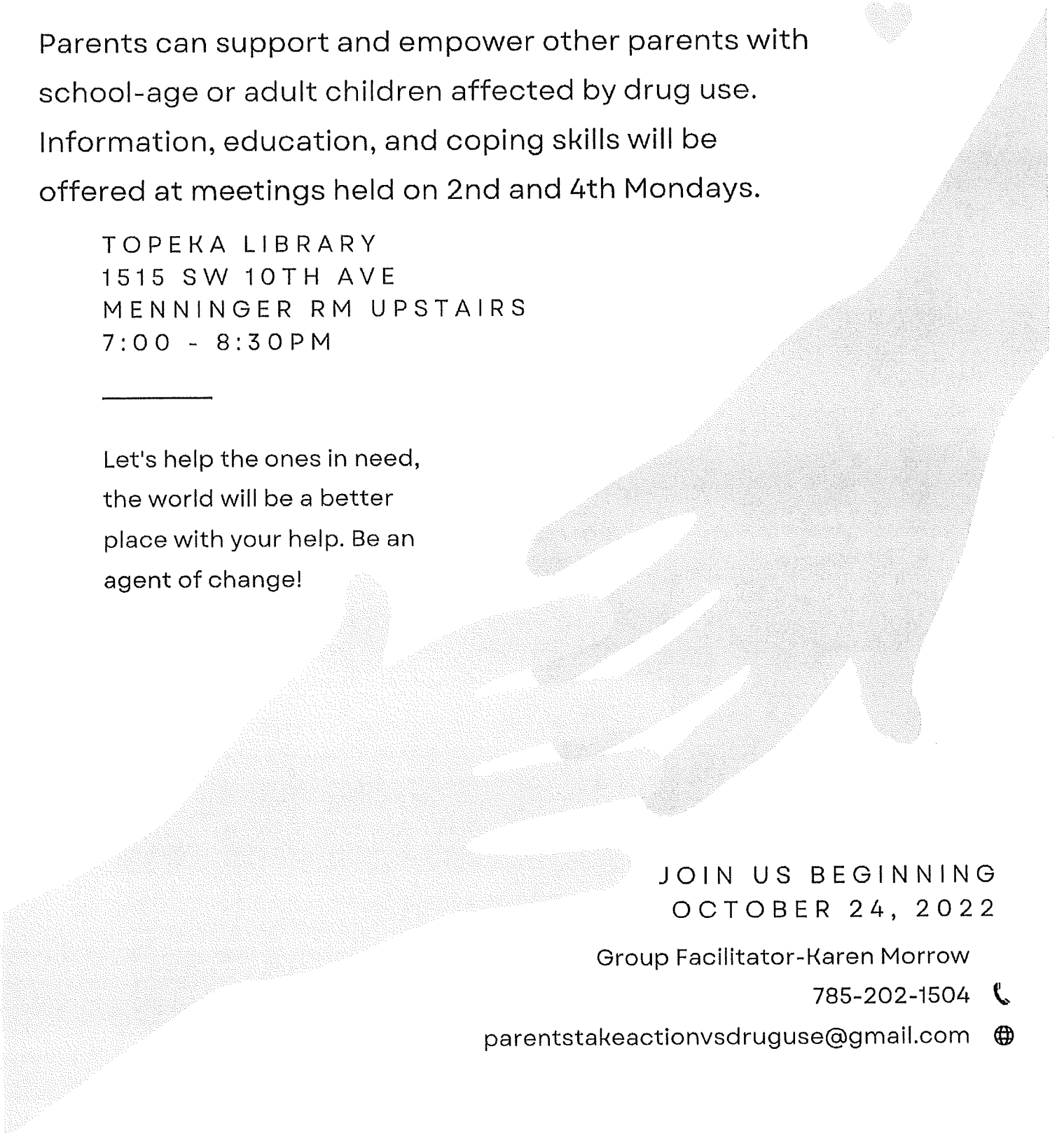

**200 TURKEY DINNERS AVAILABLE FROM THE SALVATION ARMY**

TOPEKA, KS (October 17, 2022) - This Thanksgiving, 200 families in Topeka will have a chance to enjoy a home-cooked turkey dinner with all the trimmings. The Salvation Army is taking applications starting Monday, October 24th through Friday, October 28th from 9a to 4p to receive one of the 200 meals provided, thanks to a generous donation from Cargill. The local company teamed up with The Salvation Army of Topeka to provide the turkeys. The side dishes will be provided by various companies in the community.

**In addition, the Topeka Salvation Army will be handing out the community meal in “take out” boxes on the same day as the turkey basket giveaway. Previously the Topeka Salvation Army had a sit-down meal for the Thanksgiving community meal however since Covid lingers on it was decided to stick with a drive through style of meal.**

“Thanksgiving is ultimately about family, and with this generous donation, we’ll be able to make the holiday brighter for 200 families in our community,” Captain Cristian Lopez said.

Families must apply to see if they meet the qualifications based on state poverty guidelines to receive one of the turkey baskets. Applications are being taken starting, Monday, October 24<sup>th</sup> through Friday, October 28<sup>th</sup> from 9a to 4p, at The Salvation Army Topeka at 1320 SE 6<sup>th</sup> Street during normal business hours. The meals will be handed out on Thursday, November 17<sup>th</sup> from 4:00p to 5:30p in the west parking lot of Topeka Salvation Army, 1320 SE 6<sup>th</sup> Street.
