PROGRAM: Code Officer Brad Wolfley will explain the city-wide Property Maintenance Rehabilitation Program and answer your questions:

Homeowners can receive up to \$20,000 to rehab their homes if they have a property maintenance violation. If the homeowner lives in the home 5 years after the work is done they don't pay anything back, so it is free!

Applications will be approved on a first-come, first-served basis. To qualify you must:

Provide ID for all household members

Provide proof of income for the past 60 days for all household members

All people on the deed of the property must reside in the home and have owned the house for at least one year

All work being completed must be on the actual home itself and no other buildings on the property Household must be 50% of the Annual Median Income or below to qualify. Qualifying AMI for all household sizes is \$42,033.50. Call 368-3711 for an application.
